Highlights of the autumn term 2023!

We had a long and busy start to the school year from September to December 2023.

Parental engagement - Since the autumn term commenced and the new academic year, we have **hosted 5** opportunities for parents to attend meetings with teachers and focused workshops in line with our school development priorities of supporting progress in the basic skills of reading, writing and mathematics.

We have also hosted **20 seminar lessons/workshops** providing opportunities for parents to watch a lesson being delivered to their pupils to support parents with understanding how children are being taught and learn, including the strategies we use to support their learning. The feedback from the

evaluations at the end of each session have been resoundingly positive and being used to plan future sessions planned for the spring term 2024.

Our parental engagement sessions were also identified as a strength of the school when we were visited by **Ofsted** inspectors on the 22nd and 23rd November 2023. We look forward to sharing the outcome of the inspection when the report is released in the coming weeks.

Annual Christmas production – We hosted our annual Christmas production which involves every

child in the school. Thank you for your support with the costumes and attendance. The children really showed great confidence and enjoyed performing in front of a large audience. We hope you took away a precious memory of your child's time at KPINS.

Children singing at Boothman House – Every year as part of our work to support the personal development of our pupils, our children make a special visit to the local assisted housing in the local community at Christmas time. The elderly residents enjoyed the visit and the wonderful carol concert that they performed. Our thanks to Mrs. Silvestro and Mrs. Amey who gave up their time to prepare the children as part of our after school Carol Singing Club.

Christmas Market and money raised – Following a busy autumn term, due to the commitment of the staff, their efforts and your continued support we were able to host a Christmas Market. This was a great way to bring our school community together at the end of the year and to bring some joy and fun for all. In addition, we raised £1404.27.

Safeguarding

Please ensure that you phone and inform the school office staff if you have made an alternative arrangement for someone to collect your child from the school. In line with safeguarding we will not release your child into the care of a minor (anyone under the age of 18 years), so please do not send older high school siblings to collect your child from school.

If you arrange for another adult to collect your child from school – phone ahead and inform the school or inform the class teacher at drop off in the morning, ensure that you provide them with their details (name, gender and relationship to your or the child) and also ensure that they know the password. We will not release your child to anyone who does not know the password.

Also, if you have changed your mobile number or emergency contact details please make sure they are updated as soon as possible.

Recycling school uniforms.

Please continue to support us by recycling good condition school uniforms as your child grows out of them. Remember it can help another family who may be finding it hard to purchase uniform items at full price. We will keep the container for old uniforms in the playground permanently so please keep decluttering and dropping items into the box as and when you can.

Reminder of the importance of attendance.

On the 20th November all parent/carers were sent details from the LA about the importance of regular school attendance and the processes which can result in an EPN being issued. The reason for this is that the LA have been made aware of the school attendance of numerous pupils. We felt it important to share this information with you all particularly as we were approaching the school holiday period and as a reminder to those parents where there are growing concerns about the attendance and lateness of specific pupils. We also reminded you that any absences at the end of the autumn particularly during the last week will not be approved without evidence.

We respect those families who have been open and honest with us about their plans to take their child out of school before the end of the term to travel abroad well aware of the potential consequences of their actions. All absences at the end of the term will be unauthorised until evidence has been provided and reviewed against the aim policy and exceptional leave criteria. Please be respectful our Attendance Officer is compelled to work in line with the AIM Attendance Policy and guidance provided by the Court Attendance Officer during updated training events.

A REMINDER OF OUR COMPULSARY SCHOOL UNIFORM & PE UNIFORM

Please be reminded that the school takes a hard line regarding compliance with



the school uniform. It is parents' responsibility to ensure that their child is wearing the school uniform as stipulated in the school prospectus and website. On Wednesday's we require all children in Year 1 and 2 to wear the schools PE uniform which comprises of Grey joggers (Option of black shorts in the summer) a grey top and black trainers/plimsolls and not their own sportswear. This uniform can also be worn for PE lessons, in line with their class timetables, on days other than Wednesday. All Uniform orders can be made via the Weduc App at the school shop.



It has been noted since the start of the school term that a number of children are not wearing the appropriate clothing and black shoes. Please respect the school's policy and practice by ensuring your child comes to school in the correct uniform. We thank you in advance for your support and compliance.

FREE SCHOOL MEAL ELIGIBILITY CHECK

It is important that parents check their eligibility criteria as a number of parents found themselves to be eligible during lockdown. They were then issued with free school meal vouchers which they could use to purchase food at a supermarket of their choice. It is important that you check as it may be helpful in the event of a second spike!

Parents can check to see if they meet the eligibility criteria by following the instructions below:

Step 2: Click – Check eligibility

Step 3: Click – **create an account** (Unless you already have an account in which case you go to return to your account and enter your password)

Step 6: Read and accept the privacy notice by ticking the box at the bottom of the page.
